**Golden Legacy**

Gamma Chapter’s project may become a yearly event because it was so well received by the new elementary teachers in Billings School District #2. Chapter members made and delivered 33 “TLC” bags which included note paper, candy, pencils, red apples and information about DKG along with Gamma President Julie’s DKG card. Even the men were very appreciative of this thoughtful gift; teachers helping and supporting other teachers.

Omega Chapter provided Amazon gift cards to the Children’s Receiving Home in Great Falls to buy educational programs for the Kindle Fires available to the students. The after school tutor uses the programs to help and encourage students who are academically behind in math and other essential subjects. The facility’s administrator calls the mini-grant a “Godsend.”

In Bozeman, the ripples of the mini-grant with its matching funds have been felt throughout the community as Mu Chapter shares the word about the needs of homeless students from pre-kindergarten to high school seniors. Through the efforts of President Lloyd-Ann and Mu Chapter members, the grant has generated additional donations from churches and organizations. Gifts of clothing, toiletries and food also continue to be given. When the grant was written, there were sixty homeless students and now in April, over ninety. The monies are being spent on elementary Native American books, and on food, clothing or gas cards for the students to get to school and to their jobs. Lloyd-Ann says, “This is not a hand out but the gift of a hand-up for students in need.”

The Omicron and Phi project called “*Quilting for Others*” has completed four quilts to be given to the Cancer Treatment Center in Missoula for the patients’ warmth and comfort during chemo treatments. Friday Night-Fun Night and Saturday Quilt the Day Away left the fourth and fifth grade quilters wondering when the next session would be held. President Audrey says, “Their excitement and sense of accomplishment made it all worthwhile.” Fabric and cash for supplies were given by Delta Kappa Gamma members. It’s already for the next scheduled quilting day.

Alpha Chapter is providing the funds for the children’s library at Shodair Hospital to update their collection. The librarian who is also a member of Alpha Chapter is in the process of selecting the books. Shodair Hospital is a treatment facility for children with emotional difficulties. President Cathy says, “The members are excited to see her be able to acquire these materials as she has not been able to update in recent years.”

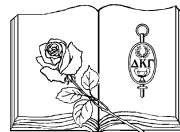

Kathleen "Kelly" Troy, Alpha Gamma, November 19, 2014



**Kathleen "Kelly" Frances Troy (1919-2014)**

Kathleen "Kelly" Frances McCormack Troy, 95, a member of Alpha Gamma Chapter, passed away November 19, 2014. She was born to Irish immigrants Dan and Anna McCormack on January 26, 1919. She was raised east of Choteau on the Burton Bench where her family had sheep. Kelly, her sisters, and brother attended school at the Ursuline Academy in Great Falls. Not only did she excel in academics and basketball, but was a most interesting woman to converse with. She became the first lady in the United States to become a weather observer for the U.S. Weather Bureau on Gore Hill.

She married Mautland Troy in Great Falls in the fall of 1945. They moved to Augusta, where they raised their family of five children.

Kelly renewed her teaching certificate after her children were in school and taught in Augusta for twenty years. She was beloved by all her students. Kelly was passionate about education, books and anything Irish. She was able to visit Ireland six times to renew her ancestry. She was a forerunner in building St. Matthias Catholic Church, a member of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International (initiated April 1977) and the Red Hat's Society.

She will always be remembered for her kindness, friendliness, generosity and deep Catholic faith.
